### Lessons From the Wash and Wag

The following article came to my computer over a year ago. I recently re-read it and it made me think of our small school, KCS, and our church CBC. We don't have a fancy facility, a lot of things are in constant need of repair, and the exterior of our buildings are not all that attractive to the eye. However, the ministry that takes place inside these walls almost 7 days a week is what is truly important.

*I'll never forget pulling into a small, one stoplight town for a ministry engagement. I coasted up to the church address, bewildered. The sign on the building read "Wash & Wag." Must have the wrong address I thought. Then, I saw it. The striking ministry glossy with the words: This Sunday, Christy Foldenaur (they spelled my name wrong)! "This church meets...in a Wash & Wag." I argued with God. I pleaded for humility and grace in the moment. Finally, I conceded that if He wanted to use me in a Wash & Wag, I would bring my best. I went to meet my host and settle in for the night. The next morning I spoke on limiting labels. The smell of wet dog permeated the air. Yet, in a very untraditional space, something remarkable happened. People arrived with open and responsive hearts, and God did a work among them. He also began a fresh work in me.*

*In the book The Selfless Way of Christ: Downward Mobility and the Spiritual Life, Henri Nouwen describes the humility of Christ and asserts, "The divine way is indeed the downward way." Following Jesus means being willing to meet in the Wash & Wag where ministry happens for 60, not 600. Humble situation, humble place, humble hearts....sounds like Jesus would be right at home.*

At KCS, we minister to about 70 students each day, and prayerfully their families as well. We aren't fancy, a lot of things are in need of repair, but as a staff and faculty, we pray that what goes on inside these cinder block walls, honors and glorifies God and is ministry of service to our families and community. Thank you for the daily opportunity to be a part of your family's life.






# Fourth Grade News


