10 Things to Remember When Your Child is Disobedient

Here are 10 things to be reminded of when the job of correcting your children seems wearisome or difficult. It is not an easy job being a parent, but it is what God has called you to and parenting is a JOY!

- 1. You disobey the Lord....and He is the *perfect* Father.
- 2. His kindness leads us to repentance.
- 3. God lovingly and patiently disciplines those He loves.
- 4. Your child's disobedience does not measure your value any more than his obedience showcases your achievement.
- 5. Your child's disobedience teaches you dependence on God.
- 6. And sometimes it's more than dependence He's after, it's complete desperation for Him.
- 7. Your child is clearly a sinner, and needs to hear the truth of the Gospel, and see it lived through you.
- 8. Times of corrections serve to remind, or establish within your child, his own sense of need for a Savior.
- 9. It's not good behavior you really desire...you want his heart.
- 10. Your child is a person, not a project.
